Market Review: During the month of June 2023 KSE-100 (the benchmark) increased by 0.30% to close the month at 41,453 points. The fiscal year 2023 remained a difficult year for Pakistan as it faced multiple macroeconomic challenges and closed at negative return of 0.21%. The month of June 2023 started on a positive note, with the market initially gaining 2% as investors expected a balanced budget that would end the long deadlock over the 9th review under the stalled IMF program. However, the steam soon fizzled out, and the index corrected by ~3% mid of the month as Budget for FY24 fell short of meeting the prior conditions demanded by the IMF, leading to more uncertainty amongst the investors. During the month Chemical, Auto Assembler, Oil & Gas Exploration Companies, Oil & Gas Marketing Comp., Cement, Power, sectors outperformed the market. On the flip-side, Fertilizer, Pharmaceuticals, Inv. Banks / Inv. Cos. / Securities Cos., Glass & Ceramics, Technology & Communication sectors underperformed the market. Foreign investors remained net buyer with the inflow of US\$ 6.26 million during the month under review, as compared to outflow of US\$ 3.51 million in previous month.

Investment Objective: The objective of First Capital Mutual Fund is to augment wealth of investors through investments geared towards securing maximum returns while simultaneously offsetting resultant risks through efficient diversification across sectors with low correlation amongst them. The management of the fund is continuously striving towards achieving its objective.
